2023-2024 Theme: Joining Forces for Advocacy

On **February 21, at 7 pm** we will be having a ZOOM presentation on the ERA. Julie Wiater Ransel of the Maryland Chapter of National Organization for Women (Maryland NOW) will be speaking to the Harford County branch of AAUW on Wednesday evening, February 21st at 7 pm via ZOOM. She will brief us on how the Maryland legislators are trying to pass a resolution in the 2024 General Assembly to affirm that Maryland legislature recognizes the federal Equal Rights Amendment as the 28th Amendment and information on other actions to take, including Congressional outreach She will be sending us materials, (post cards, information, leaflets, etc to help us in our pursuit of Equality for ALL. We MUST pass the ERA NOW!

On **March 20, at 7 pm** we will have an in-person meeting with Dr. Tittle. Dr. Lisa Tittle is a Harford County native passionate about helping people reach their educational and career goals, especially those who have previously never thought about going to college. She teaches transitional reading and writing courses along with English composition. She will be speaking to us about **Race in America and how we can talk about it**. Please join us for this important discussion. We'll meet at Harford Community College, Havre de Grace Hall, Rm 206. (This building is next to the Student Center on campus.)

In our **May 15th meeting** we will be hearing from Tracy Waite. Tracy is the President of Harford County Climate Action and has been VERY active in Environment affairs in Harford County. Her latest involvement has been "Saving Abingdon Woods!" Tracy will talk to us about how WE, the AAUW, can work to save our environment. This will be another, important meeting that will give us direction in saving our country from disaster.

Taxes, Taxes, and High Finances!

Yes, it's that time of year again as we get ready to pay the taxman. Please keep in mind as you prepare your taxes that \$69 of the \$72 you pay in national AAUW dues is tax deductible. Also, as we swing into a new year, please remember that **renewal dates for AAUW memberships will vary from member to member depending on when a person initially joined AAUW**.

As you may have noticed, your renewal date is now listed in your entry in our branch directory. As explained in the cover letter to the directory that was sent out in late January, you should receive a renewal notice email from National about 2 weeks before your membership ends.

However, this may go to your **junk or spam mailbox** so please check these locations as well as that renewal time nears. Thank heavens there is a 3-month grace period if you should happen to forget to renew.

If a person's membership lapses and then they join *after* the 90-day grace period, their new renewal date will be one year from that point in time when it is processed by National. Dues should remain the same this year with \$72 for national, \$21 for our Harford County Branch, and \$10 for state for a total of \$103.
